- If the candidate has his/her consciousness raised on the issues of closing well at an early point in the journey overseas he/she usually can navigate it well.
- We are interdependent persons, living in community in a system. What you do/or don't do affects the whole.
- Children's developmental, educational, and medical issues figure into the plan for the whole family, so we want to be on board with the parents from the first application and not at a later time to the disservice of all.

FAMILY READINESS | WISDOM & INTRODUCTION



- It is best NOT to ignore the pain loved ones and friends are VALEO feeling as you are working towards departing. They may be glad for you, but they are sad for them.
- A question like: "How are you feeling about my leaving?" is proactively opening the door to that pain and entering in. Accepting their sadness and making a plan together to stay in touch goes a long ways.
- Intentionally build a praying community of friends.



HOW TO: Family Readiness Interview & Activities

FAMILY READINESS | HOW TO CONDUCT INTERVIEW



- Set the table" for a relaxed, focused conversation.
- Ask about: 'framily', parents, siblings, work, ministries, children's particulars, other meaningful connections.
- Encourage to balance staying connected with some and saying goodbye to others.
- Encourage empathy for how others are impacted by their decision to live into their calling.

Plan about I hour (depending on schedule) for interview.

FAMILY READINESS | ACTIVITIES



- If you want to launch well, you need to leave well.
- C.R.A.F.T. & MY 360° for intentional moments of closure:
 - 1. Celebration!
 - 2. Reconciliation
 - 3. Affirmation
 - 4. Farewells
 - 5. Transition

FAMILY READINESS | ACTIVITIES



- Card Sort Activity
 - 1. Transfer MY 360 list to cards.
 - 2. Categorize by
 - a. GREEN: high impact to seek honor.
 - b. YELLOW: dependency to seek transition.
 - c. RED: hurting to seek healing.
 - 3. Sort by Closeness (Dunbar: 5 / 15 / 50 / 150)
 - 4. Set C.R.A.F.T. intentions: start closest from green category.
 - a. Repeat for each circle of closeness in each category.
 - b. We can do what you can do, not what we can't

FAMILY READINESS | ACTIVITIES



- Card Sort Activity (continue)
 - 5. Set end date to complete process
 - a. Schedule time to lean into process
 - b. Who you are is the result of the sum total of your relationships-enjoyed and endured.
 - 6. As you complete each farewell place card in COMPLETE envelope with a prayer of gratitude, release, and blessing.
 - a. As your end date, place the remainder of cards in the COMPLETE envelope with a prayer of gratitude, release, and blessing.
 - 7. Consider Grief Recovery Method for additional closure.


